



FREE RIDES FOR COVID-19 VACCINATION APPOINTMENTS EXTENDED THROUGH SEPTEMBER

Anyone age 12 and over is now, or soon will be, eligible to receive a COVID-19 vaccination. To make this process even easier, Yuba-Sutter Transit in cooperation with the Yuba and Sutter County Public Health Departments is offering fare free service to anyone traveling to or from their scheduled COVID-19 vaccination appointment. This exciting offer, which was originally scheduled to end on June 30th, has now been extended at least through September 30, 2021.

To ride free of charge, passengers must present valid confirmation of their appointment that day at any COVID-19 vaccination site in Yuba or Sutter Counties when boarding the bus. Confirmation may be in the form of an appointment card, email, or text with the passenger's name and appointment information (date, time, and location). The driver will acknowledge that the confirmation meets the requirement, and that the passenger may continue boarding.

This offer is good on all services operated by Yuba-Sutter Transit, including Dial-A-Ride, though all service eligibility and passenger policy requirements still apply. Anyone traveling with a passenger that has a scheduled appointment must provide their own appointment confirmation to qualify for a free fare.

– FARE FREE FAIR WEEK – LOCAL FIXED ROUTES & DIAL-A-RIDE SERVICE FARE FREE JUNE 21ST – 26TH

In cooperation with the Yuba-Sutter Fair, no fares will be charged on any of Yuba-Sutter Transit's local fixed route or Dial-A-Ride buses during fair week starting Monday, June 21st through Saturday, June 26th. To replace the lost revenue, this first-time fair sponsorship event will be funded through a state grant to promote transit ridership.

No special tickets or passes are needed during this free fare week as local fixed route and Dial-A-Ride passengers will simply board the bus free of charge. All Dial-A-Ride service eligibility and passenger policy requirements will still apply, and fares will continue to be charged on rural and Sacramento routes. Due to the early closure, Yuba-Sutter Transit's service will be re-routed from Plumas Street all day on June 19th.

Route 1 buses will operate on Olive Street between Colusa Avenue and Forbes Street and Route 2 will operate on Shasta Street between Colusa Avenue and Bridge Street. The Plumas Street bus stops at Church Street and Bridge Street will not be in service during this time nor will the Route 1 bus stops at Forbes and Almond.
