



BARGAIN PRICED MONTHLY PASSES NOW AVAILABLE FOR YOUTH, SENIORS & DISABLED

Accepted on All Local & Rural Routes

Yuba-Sutter Transit's wildly popular discount monthly bus pass program for area youth, seniors and persons with disabilities has been extended for another year with a new grant from the Feather River Air Quality Management District (FRAQMD). This grant is sufficient to allow the cost of each discount monthly pass (regularly priced at \$15 a month) to be reduced to just \$5 a month for use as valid fare payment on all six local and three rural routes through December 2017.

This program began in September 2005 when the monthly local fixed route youth pass (for ages 5 – 18) was first offered for just \$5 using a FRAQMD grant to off-set the lost fare revenue. Additional FRAQMD funding over the years has allowed the program to expand to now offer the same deep discounts for monthly senior and disabled passes and all three discount monthly passes are now accepted on the three rural routes as well. Yuba-Sutter Transit expects to sell 14,000 discount monthly passes and provide a projected 350,000 passenger trips to discount monthly pass holders in 2017 which would be similar to the year-end figures for 2016.

Regular and discount passes are available at any Yuba-Sutter Transit pass sales outlet (see next page) from the 24th of each month through the 7th of the following month. Passes are also available by mail or at the Yuba-Sutter Transit office all month long.

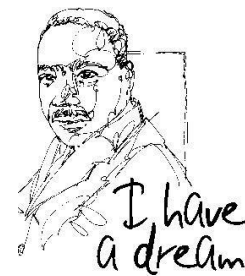
REGULAR COMMUTERS SAVE BIG BUCKS RIDING THE BUS

Did you overspend for Christmas? Not looking forward to opening your mail this month? Maybe you should ride the bus more often this year! According to the latest "Transit Savings Report" from the American Public Transportation Association (APTA), the average savings for a regular transit user is now \$9,712 a year (more than \$800 a month) even with relatively low fuel prices. How else could you so easily add almost ten grand a year to your household budget – tax free, no less?

This figure is based on commuting by public transportation compared to owning and driving a mid-sized vehicle at the December 21, 2016 national average gas price of \$2.25 per gallon (much higher locally) and the national average rate of \$166 per month for unreserved parking. While this report assumes an individual in a two-person household who takes public transportation and lives with one less car, you don't have to sell your car to still realize significant savings!

For those who commute to downtown Sacramento, parking typically costs more than the \$128 price of a monthly Yuba-Sutter Transit commuter bus pass. Combine that with the fuel savings; reduced wear and tear on both you and your car; and, any transit subsidy that you may get from your employer and you will save big – really big – by riding the bus.

Just how much can you save? Try the fuel savings calculator at www.publictransportation.org to estimate your own savings based on your commute distance; actual parking and fuel prices; the type of vehicle you drive; and, the average miles per gallon figure that you experience. One thing is certain – the more you ride, the more you save so try it today!

STILL LOOKING FOR LOCAL SOFT LAUNCH VOLUNTEERS

Yuba-Sutter Transit volunteers are still needed to test the new Connect Card system when we begin to transition to the new regional electronic fare payment system. This process started with a soft launch phase in mid-November at the Sacramento Regional Transit District (RT). The other eight participating transit systems, including Yuba-Sutter Transit, will soon join the soft launch as early as the end of this month in advance of the expected full public system roll-out this spring.

Here's where you come in! We are still looking for volunteer Yuba-Sutter Transit passengers who use any of our services to test the Connect Card system during the soft launch period. We need regular transit riders just like you to use the system and provide feedback.

EXPIRING DISCOUNT PHOTO ID CARDS EXTENDED ONE YEAR TO DECEMBER 31, 2017

If you have a valid discount photo identification (ID) card with an expiration date of December 31, 2016, please note that it will continue to be accepted by Yuba-Sutter Transit through December 2017. A letter with this same information was recently mailed to the last known address of those who were issued these 2016 cards.

This one time extension is prompted by the pending conversion to the new Connect Card electronic fare card system. When fully implemented, all discount ID card holders will be asked to exchange their current cards for a new discount Connect Card photo ID card. To keep 2016 card holders from having to come in twice in just a few months, all 2016 cards will continue to be accepted as usual by Yuba-Sutter Transit through 2017.

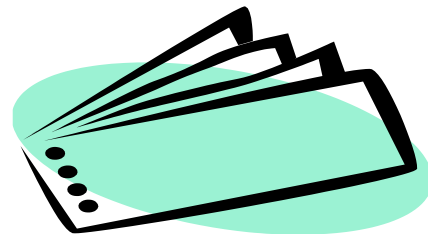
